Dr. Cheryl Renée Gooch is an academic leader, published scholar and active historical researcher. Since its release, *Hinsonville's Heroes* has maintained active interest among diverse audiences, including the National Park Service Fort Stevens Day; and numerous Civil War Round Table groups, including Baltimore Civil War Round Table; Old Baldy Philadelphia Civil War Round Table; and Eastern Pennsylvania Civil War Round Table; Grand Army of the Republic Museum; National Civil War Museum; Camp William Penn Museum; and Delaware History Museum.

Dr. Gooch has been a featured author on PCN (Pennsylvania Cable Network)-TV's *PA Books*.

Dr. Gooch will discuss her book, *Hinsonville's Heroes: Black Civil War Soldiers of Chester County, Pennsylvania* (The History Press, February 2018) which traces the stories of 18 residents of Hinsonville, a free black community in southeast Pennsylvania, who fought for the Union. The 19th century village of Hinsonville attracted both free and determined to be free people who championed religious freedom, higher education, land ownership and equal rights.

Thoughts on the Harrisburg Civil War Round Table

While going through Dick Sommers papers, the editor ran across a flyer written by Dick for the Harrisburg Civil War Round Table Fifteenth Anniversary Program on May 17, 1974. As you read this, think about how you can volunteer to keep our Round Table vibrant.

The Harrisburg Civil War Round Table was founded in 1959, on the eve of the Civil War centennial. Enthusiasm for the war ran high in those days, and the birth of a spate of Round Tables was but another aspect of a national phenomenon which included everything from the writing of scholarly tomes to the marketing of General Grant coloring books. Such mass interest, however, proved short lived. It peaked before the centennial ended and then rapidly subsided. Gone now are the hucksters selling their pseudo Civil War gimmicks. Gone, too, are the vast numbers of books on the war—some good, more bad—published in the late 1950's and early 1960's. This decline in interest has affected Round Tables, also. Some Round Tables have expired; others are moribund; and still others have ossified into closed cliques incapable of self perpetuation.

Our Round Table has escaped this fate that has overtaken so many others. After a slight decline in the late 1960's we have revived these past 3 years to the extent that we are now stronger, more vital, more active than at any period in our history. Why have we succeeded where others have failed? To begin with, a determined inner cadre, including several charter members, kept the flame burning through lean years as well as fat. Neither the organization nor the cadre, moreover, were restrictive. New members were constantly sought for the group, and as they displayed ability, they were welcomed into the leadership. This combination of persevering, continuity and new talent has been one of our greatest strengths. Then, too, we have never yielded to the temptation to reduce the number of dinner meetings and field trips—an unending retreat that has led many other Round Tables to eventual destruction. We instead continued to provide a full schedule of interesting, qualified speakers and exciting visits to historic sites. Such events, in turn, attract new members, who have joined throughout our history—in ever increasing numbers these past three years. That more and more members mustered in derives from the obvious truth: Interest in a given historical event exists independently of any arbitrary lapse of time since that event. The study of Napoleon, after all, did not cease one hundred years after Waterloo, and there is no reason that interest in the Civil War should have ended a century after the collapse of the Confederacy. The interest in the war is still there, and we have continued to tap it.

In drawing together such people, the Round Table provides a medium for exposing them to eminent scholars. It also represents a forum for discussion and a means for touring battlefields. Then, too, it affords the fellowship of shared interests. Laymen and professionals from many backgrounds all find common ground in their mutual interest in the Civil War. Such interest, such benefits, such vitality have been the strength of the Harrisburg Civil War Round Table during our first fifteen years. They also offer every prospect of a bright future.

In the 46 years since Dick composed these thoughts, the Harrisburg Civil War Round Table has continued to attract superb speakers and to sponsor exciting field trips; however, membership has declined. We need to attract new members willing to devote time and energy to keeping the organization vital and our nation's history alive.
