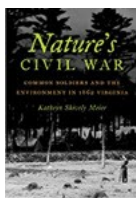

September 18—Dr. Kathryn J. Shively
Nature's Civil War: Common Soldiers and the Environment in 1862 Virginia

Dr. Shively is an associate professor of history at Virginia Commonwealth University, where she specializes in military, medical, and environmental history of the Civil War. She is the book review editor of the *Journal of the Civil War Era*, and her book, *Nature's Civil War*, won the 2014 Wiley-Silver Prize for best first book on the Civil War.

In her talk entitled, "Nature's Civil War: Common Soldiers and the Environment in 1862 Virginia," Dr. Shively will explain that Civil War soldiers perceived their environments as responsible for their deteriorating physical and mental health during the Shenandoah Valley and Peninsula campaigns. In response, soldiers developed self-care techniques, from eradicating insects to straggling for shelter, in order to combat their natural enemies. The stakes were high, as two-thirds of soldier mortalities resulted from disease rather than combat.

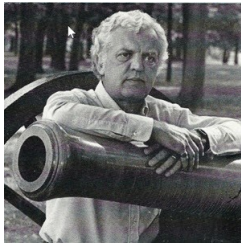
August was a busy month for the Harrisburg CWRT's Board of Directors:

- ◆ We reached out by phone or email to all our members. In Memoriam



William "Bill" Williams passed away September 2. He was a long-time and valued member of the Harrisburg Civil War Round Table, serving as President in 1983-84. He was also a member of the Camp Curtin Historical Society, the Friends of Gettysburg, and the Gettysburg Battlefield Preservation Society.

Bill was a journalist, starting in high school as a copyboy at the Scranton Tribune and progressing to bureau chief for The Associated Press in Harrisburg from 1974 to 1978. He moved then to state politics, retiring in 1996 as the director of the Republican Caucus Communications Department for the Pennsylvania House of Representatives. In retirement he continued writing, including two Civil War novels, *Days of Darkness: The*

Gettysburg Civilians, and *The Vast Procession of Misery: Lee's Wounded Retreat from Gettysburg*.

The memorial service for Bill will be at a future date at the Camp Hill United Methodist Church.
