October 16—Dr. Rachel A. Shelden
The Antebellum U. S. Congress

Dr. Shelden is Associate Professor of History and Director of the George and Ann Richards Civil War Era Center at Penn State University. She is the author of *Washington Brotherhood: Politics, Social Life, and the Coming of the Civil War* (University of North Carolina Press, 2013), which received honorable mention for the Wiley-Silver Prize for the best first book on the American Civil War and was a selection of the History Book Club. She was co-editor, with Gary Gallagher, of *A Political Nation: New Directions in Mid-Nineteenth-Century American Political History* (University of Virginia Press, 2012).



Dr. Shelden received her BA from Stanford University, an MA from the University of Virginia and was awarded her PhD from the University of Virginia. Prior to Penn State, she taught at the University of Oklahoma.

If you haven't looked at our website recently, you should give it another look. We've made a lot of improvements to it. Check it out! www.harrisburgcwrt.org

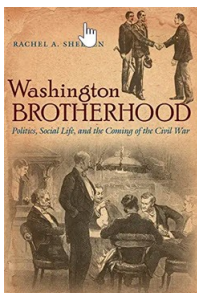

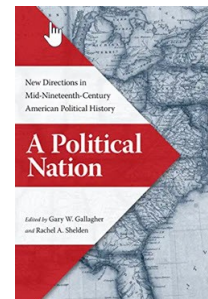

In Memoriam



Ed Bearss passed away September 15 at the age of 97. He had a long career with the National Park Service, rising in 1981 to Chief Historian. His unique presentation style and obvious passion for his subject made him a much sought after tour guide and speaker—even into his 90s.

He was committed to battlefield preservation, serving as a member of the Civil War Trust board, and as historian emeritus for the successor organization—the American Battlefield Trust.

Ed spoke to the Harrisburg Civil War Round Table several times to a captive audience.

Field Trip Update

As a result of the coronavirus pandemic, the HCWRT was forced to postpone the fall field trip to Fredericksburg that was tentatively scheduled for October 24. This follows on the heels of the cancellation of our “sold out” spring field trip to Antietam last May. This is pretty discouraging news for those who were looking forward to our popular field trips, not to mention for the guides we had lined up. Our finances took a big hit, too. Our treasurer had to refund all the payments he had received for the spring field trip, and we lost two major fundraising opportunities. After membership dues and donations, field trips are our biggest source of revenue.

The good news is, our guides for both the spring and fall field trips have agreed to simply “punt” into 2021, and we’ve rescheduled both trips in the hope that, by next year, a vaccine will be available and life can return to some semblance of normal. Our spring field trip to Antietam, with Dennis Frye as our guide, is rescheduled for Saturday, May 1, 2021, and our fall field trip to Fredericksburg, with Chris Mackowski as our guide, is rescheduled for Saturday, October 23, 2021.

We will give first chance to sign up for the rescheduled spring field trip to those who signed up for last spring’s trip, then open up any remaining seats. More details to follow.
