

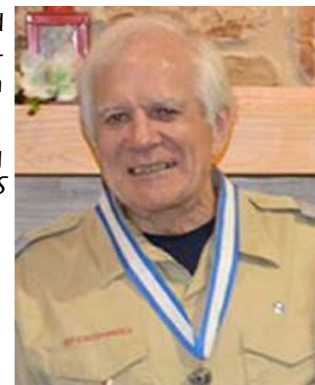
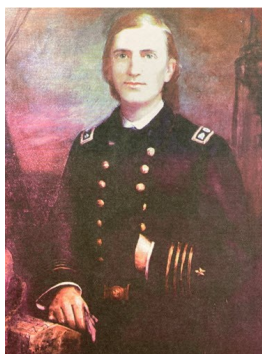

SEAL of the Sounds—William B. Cushing, Commander, U. S. Navy

Born in Schuylkill County, Jim grew up in Pine Grove. After high school, he was graduated from Lebanon Valley College. Jim and his wife, Cathy, live in Mechanicsburg; they are the parents of a son and daughter, and have five grandchildren, a great grandchild and two more on the way.

Jim will recount the story of the celebrated naval hero, William B. Cushing, who led a daring torpedo boat commando attack that sank the Confederacy's formidable ironclad ram, the *CSS Albemarle*, on the Roanoke River at Plymouth, North Carolina, in October 1864.

Antietam Field Trip Postponed Until September 11, 2021

By this time last year, we had sold out our spring 2020 field trip to Antietam with guide Dennis Frye. We wound up having to postpone that trip because of the pandemic. In fairness to those who signed up, we returned their checks and said we would offer them first dibs on signing up for the rescheduled trip. We were hoping that by May of this year things would be back to normal.

As it turns out, we were too optimistic. After consulting with Dennis Frye and the bus company that supports our field trips, we've further postponed the field trip to Antietam until Saturday, September 11, 2021. We are hoping that by then, everyone who wants to go on the trip will be fully vaccinated, and we can board a bus without jeopardizing the health of our participants. HCWRT History

November 1959 the HCWRT also had a talk on naval operations. Commander Ray Cobaugh, USNR spoke on the Civil War at Sea. He was also the newsletter editor and commented that even a foot soldier would find worthwhile information in his talk.

In 1963, the HCWRT sponsored the 5th National Assembly of Civil War Round Tables in cooperation with *Civil War Times Illustrated*. The Assembly honored the Centennial of the Battle of Gettysburg.

February 1967, Colonel Nye of the Nye-Sommers lecture fame, spoke on Jeb Stuart and the Gettysburg Campaign. A panel of past presidents Ed Olmstead and Bob Hoffsommer discussed pros and cons of Lee's orders and Jeb's execution.

1967 Field Trips/Events: February-Cobaugh Museum; March-First Manassas; April-Seven Days; May-Flight of Booth; June-Gettysburg Cannon; September-Cedar Mountain; October-Gettysburg Retreat.

Membership Policy

An updated New Member Dues Policy was approved by the HCWRT Board on January 30. The following will be implemented, and was piloted this past Campaign, for future Campaign years.

1. New Campaign dues are payable beginning July 1 every year for all current members.
2. We will target September and October for the collection of new dues from membership.
3. Any new member dues paid after October and through February will be collected at the full rate.
4. Any new member dues paid in March through April will be charged at half the annual rate.
5. Any new member dues paid after May 1 will be considered dues paid for the following Campaign year.

This new policy change helps to streamline the dues collection process as well being fair to new members who join our organization throughout the Campaign year.
