June 11—Bert Dunkerly Cold Harbor—Myths and Misconceptions

Robert M. (Bert) Dunkerly is an historian, award-winning author, and speaker who is actively involved in historic preservation and research. He holds a degree in History from St. Vincent College and a Masters in Historic Preservation from Middle Tennessee State University. He has worked at fourteen historic sites, written twelve books and numerous scholarly articles. Mr. Dunkerly's research includes archaeology, colonial life, military history, and historic commemoration.

He is currently a Park Ranger at Richmond National Battlefield Park. He is a past President of the Richmond Civil War Round Table, and serves on the Preservation Commission for the American Revolution Round Table-

Richmond. Mr. Dunkerly has taught courses at Central Virginia Community College, the University of Richmond, and the Virginia Historical Society. He has visited over 500 battlefields and over 1000 historic sites worldwide. He enjoys exploring local bookstores, battlefields, and breweries, not necessarily in that order.

We had to cancel our last four dinner meetings and a sold-out field trip due to the pandemic. It was beginning to look as if Campaign 61 might be our last. Fast forward to June of 2021. Thanks to a dedicated nationwide vaccination effort, we've turned the corner on this pandemic. We are planning to return to the Radisson for dinner meetings in September. All of the speakers Al Mackey lined up for Campaign 62 agreed to make their presentations by Zoom, culminating in our Nye-Sommers lecture last month, where more than 85 participants tuned in to hear Dr. Allen C. Guelzo give one of the best talks we're ever had. People from as far away as Louisville, KY tuned in. Our members have demonstrated their support for our efforts with dues and donations in excess of \$7,000. Our September field trip to Antietam is sold out, and our October trip to Fredericksburg is filling up fast. *We're on a roll!*

We've managed to attract six new members in the middle of a pandemic, no easy task. We will close out Campaign 62 on Friday, June 11 with a bang at our annual business meeting, where our committee chairs will present reports and we will hold elections, before turning the floor over to NPS Ranger Bert Dunkerly who will give us his perspective on the battle of Cold Harbor, one of the bloodiest Union defeats of the Civil War. This is the third time we've scheduled Bert to give this talk. The first time he was snowed in, the second time the pandemic caused us to cancel, and this time, we had to switch to Zoom. Let's show our support for this speaker, and for our organization, by coming out in large numbers for Campaign 62's grand finale. Annual Business Meeting & Elections

As part of our annual business meeting on Friday, June 11, we will hold elections for two officer positions and one position on our board of directors. We have excellent candidates for all three positions. Norm Daniels and Ed Hicks have indicated they are willing to stay on in their current positions as Treasurer and Secretary, providing critically needed institutional memory. Mark Blanchard, who joined our Round Table in December, has indicated a willingness to serve a six-year term as a Director, replacing Rick Eiserman, whose term ends in June. Mark serves as Assistant Superintendent of Secondary Education for the Cumberland Valley School District, and was the principal of Cumberland Valley High School and Gettysburg High School prior to that. He has a Doctorate of Education from George Washington University. His administrative skills and educational background equip him well to advise the Board on a host of issues, and carry on the good work of Rick Eiserman.

Rick served as the HCWRT's president from 1995 to 1996, and was our primary liaison with the CWRT Congress. He helped organize the CWRT Congress' convention at the National Civil War Museum in Harrisburg in the summer of 2018, a high-profile event the HCWRT co-hosted. A retired Lieutenant Colonel in the U.S. Army who went on to teach at the Army War College, Rick was also a member of the Atlanta and Kansas City CWRTs, and brought a wealth of experience and insight to our Round Table. We are deeply grateful to Rick for his service.

Speaking of the National Civil War Museum, Wayne Motts, the museum's CEO and a long-time HCWRT member, has accepted a new position as President and CEO of the Gettysburg Foundation. We wish Wayne all the best in his new calling, and thank him for all the support he has given our Round Table over the years, and his prodigious efforts to make Harrisburg a mecca for students of the Civil War.

2021 CWR7 Congress Conference Slated for September



The 2021 CWRT Congress Conference will take place September 17-19 in Blackwood, NJ, across the Delaware River from Philadelphia. This year's conference will be hosted by the Old Baldy CWRT, and will focus on sustainability of Civil War round tables. There will be presentations on History Day, recruiting college students, Historic Preservation Commissions, and marketing. The conference will also offer workshops on board organization, member retention, the post-pandemic "new normal," organi-


