Friday, January 28 — D. Scott Hartwig Writing About Antietam

D. Scott Hartwig retired in 2014 as the supervisory park historian at Gettysburg National Military Park after a 34-year career in the National Park Service, nearly all of it spent at Gettysburg. He won the NPS regional Free-

the National Park Service, nearly all of it spent at Gettysburg. He won the NPS regional Freeman Tilden Award for excellence in interpretation in 1993, and played a critical role in developing Gettysburg's on-site-interpretation and living history programming, and distance and satellite education efforts. He was a key player in designing all aspects of Gettysburg's new museum/visitor center.

Mr. Hartwig is the author of *To Antietam Creek: The Maryland Campaign from September 3 to September 16*, published in September 2012 by Johns Hopkins University Press, and is currently working on its sequel, tentatively titled, *I Dread The Thought of the Place: The Battle of Antietam*, which covers the battle and end of the Maryland Campaign of 1862. He has also authored numerous articles, essays, and other books on the Civil War, and has appeared on the History Channel, Discovery Channel and Pennsylvania Cable Network.

Mr. Hartwig will share insights he gained in the course of his research and writing, and will re-examine, among other things, the complicated relationship between President Lincoln and General George B. McClellan.

President's Pen

Our January engagement was originally scheduled for Friday, January 21, but the only day we could schedule my mother's funeral was Saturday, January 22. Since we have reverted to virtual meetings on Zoom and I host those sessions from my home computer, we pushed our meeting back one week to Friday, January 28, to allow me enough time to prepare for her funeral. Our speaker, Scott Hartwig, was most accommodating.

Following the death of my father in 2015, I decided to retire early from my job as an attorney for the US Army in Germany and move to Hershey so I could take better care of my mother. I have no regrets about that decision. Were it not for her, I would probably still be overseas and have never enjoyed the intellectual stimulation and camaraderie I found when I joined the Harrisburg Civil War Round Table. In more ways than one, my mother was the reason I am here.

I spent an inordinate amount of time in the emergency room waiting areas at the Milton S. Hershey Medical Center in early January. The omicron surge has overwhelmed the staff there. It was like a scene out of Dante's Inferno. That experience underscored the wisdom of our board's decision to go back to holding meetings on Zoom until this pandemic subsides. All I can say is get vaccinated, get boosted, mask up, and don't take any unnecessary risks. Let us pray that this too shall pass.

I also received word last week that we lost Dr. Dave Blahna under even more tragic circumstances last October, just three days before he was scheduled to join us on our fall field trip to Fredericksburg. I will never forget how Dave pointed out at one of our square table sessions that protections we have come to expect under the law of war, which is international by its very nature, do not apply in civil wars, which are the worst kind of wars, pitting fellow citizens against one another, brother against brother. We all learned a lot from Dave. Please keep his family in your thoughts and prayers, and his warning about civil wars in the back of your mind.

We can also learn a great deal from our January speaker. Coming as it does on the heels of our memorable September 11 field trip to Antietam, Scott Hartwig's talk on "Writing About Antietam" could not be more timely. Scott is putting the finishing touches to his second magnum opus on the battle, and will share valuable insights he acquired in the process of researching and writing those works. Be there!



Longtime Harrisburg CWRT member Dr. David Blahna, 74, died on October 20 of injuries sustained near his home when a driver stuck him while he was crossing a busy road in front of Rossmoyne Elementary School. Efforts to revive him were unavailing. He left behind a wife and two sons.


