

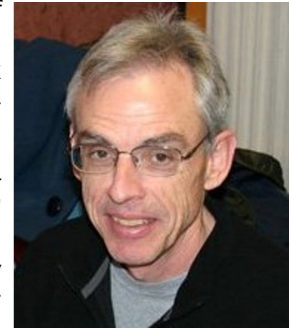

### Friday, November 11—John S. Heiser The Great Reunion of 1913 at Gettysburg

Join us on November 11 for a special Veterans Day presentation on The Great Reunion of Civil War veterans that took place on the Gettysburg battlefield in the summer of 1913. We are privileged to have as our speaker John S. Heiser, who served as a National Park Service Historian at Gettysburg prior to his retirement in 2020, and whose eloquent lectures and inspiring battle walks attracted large and enthusiastic audiences.



The Reunion of 1913 was hoped to be a unique encampment, a massive assembly of Union and Confederate veterans gathered together on one of the most significant of Civil War battlefields to observe and celebrate the 50th anniversary of the Battle of Gettysburg, what many considered to have been the “High Water Mark of the Rebellion.” Not only was it an opportunity for Pennsylvania to host such a momentous event, but a chance for the United States Government to showcase the transformation of Gettysburg from battlefield to memorial park, where the armies of both North and South would forever be memorialized.



The response from veterans North and South was overwhelming - over 50,000 former foes came to Gettysburg. It was a gathering that some believed would be a disaster with no good coming from it. But America was at a turning point, both socially and internationally, and the politicians who chose to ignore the event were caught off guard by its significance and the spirit of brotherhood and unification exhibited by former enemies who camped side by side on the battlefield where so many of them had lost comrades and risked so much to decide the fate of this nation. Was this Great Reunion finally the “national reunification” so many had hoped for 50 years after the final shot of the battle had been fired?

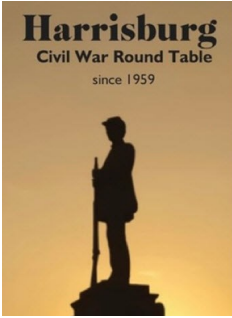
## *Reminder—Dues & Donations*
