# HCWR7 Launches Its 65th Campaign Year



C.W. Goodyear, author of a new biography on the life of President Garfield, has accepted our invitation to be our anniversary speaker. Goodyear appeared on the Gilder-Lehrman Book Breaks program in July, was interviewed by National Civil War Museum CEO Jeffrey Nichols at the Midtown Scholar bookstore and by GEN (Ret.) Stanley McCrystal at the Politics & Prose bookstore in Washington, DC, and has also appeared on "Amanpour & Company" on PBS. His biography of Garfield is a runaway best-seller that has received wide critical acclaim. Mr. Goodyear will focus on how Garfield became one of the youngest Union Generals in the Civil War and one of the most effective members of Congress, before being elected President in 1880. We're looking forward to a stimulating presentation and spirited Q&A.

I hope everyone is enjoying a pleasant summer break after our successful 64<sup>th</sup> campaign year. While we have no engagements in July or August, we have been very busy getting ready for Campaign 65.

Our programs chair has been booking world-class speakers for the coming year. Here are a few "previews of coming attractions:"

- Dan Welch, a seasonal park ranger at Gettysburg and the editor of Gettysburg Magazine, kicks off our campaign on Friday, September 15 with a riveting account of how Brigadier General George Sears Greene's brigade heroically defended Culp's Hill against relentless attacks by superior numbers of Confederate forces on July 2, 1863. Mr. Welch gave a spell-binding talk on this topic at Sacred Trust on July 2, 2023 and has agreed to do an encore performance for us. We aim to start off with a bang!
- Author Scott L. Mingus, Sr., follows up on Friday, October 13 with a detailed examination of the whereabouts of Cavalry Commander J.E.B. Stuart before and during the Battle of Gettysburg, with a focus on what slowed him down in York and Cumberland counties. Mr. Mingus will also be our guide in November for our fall field trip to study the Second Battle of Winchester, which opened the door for Lee's army to invade the North. - In honor of Black History Month, Gettysburg Park Ranger John D. Hoptak will regale us on Friday, February 16, 2024 with an account of the large number of African-Americans from South Central Pennsylvania who joined the 54<sup>th</sup> Massachusetts Infantry, the unit depicted in the epic motion picture, "Glory." Mr. Hoptak will literally put the identities and the fate of these gallant soldiers in your hands!
- Our big event of the year will be our 65<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Banquet, which will take place on May 17, 2024. See our cover story.

Our Round Table is sending a five-member delegation to the CWRT Congress' Sustainability Conference in Gettysburg the last weekend of August. Steve Smith has been invited to participate in a panel discussion to kick off the conference, where he will share some of the techniques we used to survive the pandemic and emerge stronger than we were before. Mark Blanchard will serve as a docent at a special tour of the Spangler Farm for conference participants on Sunday. This is a great opportunity for us to network and raise the profile of our Round Table nationwide.

So, there is much to look forward to in Campaign 65. Mostly, I look forward to seeing you at our engagements, and to sharing the fellowship and camaraderie that are the hallmarks of our Round Table.



# Campaign 65 Field Trips Filling Up Fast

The Harrisburg and Hershey CWRTs will team up again to sponsor exceptional field trips during Campaign 65.

### Saturday, November 4, 2023

Our first trip is to Winchester, VA, to study the Second Battle of Winchester, a devastating Union defeat that opened the door for Lee's 1863 invasion of Pennsylvania.






Our guide will be Scott L. Mingus, Sr., co-author of the leading book on the battle.

### Saturday, May 4, 2024

On our second trip, we will head south again to study one of the hardest-fought battles of the Overland Campaign of 1864, at Spot-sylvania Court House.

Chris Mackowski, who served as our guide to the Wilderness, Fredericksburg, and Chancellorsville, is back by popular demand.

Our visit will coincide with the 160<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Spotsylvania battle.






The cost of each trip is \$95.00 per person. To reserve a seat, download the flyer for each trip from the Events page of the Harrisburg CWRT website: <a href="https://harrisburgcwrt.org/events">https://harrisburgcwrt.org/events</a> Fill it out and mail the registration form to our Treasurer, Steve Williamson, at the address on the flyer with a check for \$25.00 to hold your seat. The \$70.00 balance is due a month prior to each trip. You can also book on the website using PayPal.

To date, 33 field trippers have signed up for Winchester, and 28 for the Spotsylvania. The bus only holds 55, and remaining seats are likely to go fast, so . . . **Don't delay, register today!** 

# Update on Battlefield Preservation

Battlefield preservation remains an important part of our Round Table's mission and we take it seriously. At our Board of Directors meeting on June 17, Norm Daniels briefed the Board on various opportunities to support battlefield preservation through the American Battlefield Trust. The Board voted to send \$1,000 to help save one of the last unprotected parcels of land at Antietam, with a 2-to-1 match. The 20-acre parcel includes the Jacob Avey farmhouse. The Elliott burial map indicates Confederate soldiers were buried on the land.

It's never too late to save a piece of our history, until it is.
