
The Second Battle of Winchester, Winchester, Virginia

Please join the *Harrisburg and Hershey Civil War Round Tables* on Saturday, November 4, 2023 as we visit Winchester, Virginia, the site of the Second Battle of Winchester, the Confederate victory in mid-June of 1863 that opened the door to Gettysburg.

As the Army of Northern Virginia pushed west into the Shenandoah Valley and then north to the Potomac, the one significant force that stood in its way was Major General Robert H. Milroy's Union division of the Eighth Army Corps in the vicinity of Winchester. Milroy was convinced the approaching enemy consisted of nothing more than cavalry or was merely a feint, and so defied repeated instructions to withdraw. In fact, the enemy consisted of General Lee's veteran Second Corps under Lt. General Richard S. Ewell. Milroy's outnumbered and largely inexperienced men were up against some of Lee's finest veterans.

The complex maneuvering and fighting on June 13-15 cost Milroy hundreds of killed and wounded and about 4,000 captured (roughly one-half of his command), with the remainder routed from the battlefield. The combat cleared the northern end of the Shenandoah Valley of Federal troops, demonstrated Lee could obtain supplies on the march, justified the elevation of Ewell to replace the recently deceased Stonewall Jackson, and sent shockwaves through the Northern states.



Many of the Union troops captured at Winchester were Pennsylvania-Germans from South Central Pennsylvania. They spent a lifetime seeking redemption, arguing their three-day "forlorn hope" delayed the Rebels long enough to allow the Army of the Potomac to arrive and defeat Lee at Gettysburg. We are fortunate to have the York-based co-author of the leading book on this forgotten battle to lead us on this field trip, to see where so many of our ancestors put up such a gallant fight against overwhelming odds.
