# "Where All So Well Did Their Duty": George Sears Greene's Brigade at Gettysburg

Join us on Friday, September 15, as Dan Welch recounts the heroic defense of Culp's Hill by Brigadier General George Sears Greene's Brigade. Against overwhelming odds, this lone Union brigade held Culp's Hill in a climactic action on July 2, 1863.

Learn about Greene, his men, and their gallant service on the slope of Culp's Hill in this exciting program, which electrified attendees at this summer's Sacred Trust lectures. What better way to kick off our 65<sup>th</sup>Anniversary campaign year, or commerate the 160<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Battle of Gettysburg?





Mr. Welch is an educator with a public school district in northeast Ohio. Previously, he served as the education programs coordinator for the Gettysburg Foundation, and continues to serve as a seasonal park ranger at Gettysburg National Military Park. Mr. Welch is the editor of the long-running *Gettysburg Magazine* and has been a contributing member at Emerging Civil War for over seven years. He is the coauthor of two works in the Emerging Civil War Series: *The Last Road North: A Guide to the Gettysburg Campaign, 1863* and *Never Such A Campaign: The Battle of Second Manassas, August 28-30, 1862*. Mr. Welch has also coedited several volumes in the Emerging Civil War's Tenth Anniversary Series. He is

the co-author of *Ohio at Antietam: The Buckeye State's Sacrifice on America's Bloodiest Day* with the History Press.



## Campaign 65 Field Trip Update

The Harrisburg and Hershey CWRTs will team up again on Saturday, November 4 to sponsor a field trip to Winchester, VA, to study the Second Battle of Winchester, a devastating Union defeat that opened the door for Lee's 1863 invasion of Pennsylvania. Our guide will be Scott L. Mingus, Sr., co-author of the leading book on the battle.

On Saturday, May 4, 2024, we will head south again to study one of the hardest-fought battles of the Overland Campaign of 1864, at Spotsylvania Court House. Chris Mackowski, who served as our guide to the Wilderness, Fredericksburg, and Chancellorsville, is back by popular demand. Our visit will coincide with the 160<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Spotsylvania battle.



## Field Trip Details


Cost of each trip is \$95.00 per person.
