
Friday, February 16 — John D. Hoptak

"All the Boys in Our Place Were Ready: Hardly Anyone Who Could Shoulder a Musket Stayed 'Home:" South Central Pennsylvanians in the 54th Massachusetts Infantry

In honor of Black History Month, please join us on Friday, February 16, as National Park Service Ranger John D. Hoptak pays a special tribute to the many South-Central Pennsylvanians who fought in the celebrated 54th Massachusetts Infantry.


The 54th Massachusetts remains one of the most famous fighting units of the Civil War. One of the first African-American regiments recruited during the war, their story was told, in part, in the award-winning 1989 movie *Glory*. However, many will be surprised to learn that when the 54th Massachusetts was first organized and first marched off to war, there were more men from Pennsylvania in the ranks of this storied regiment than from any other state, including more than 100 men who hailed from South Central Pennsylvania—places like Mercersburg, Shippensburg, Carlisle, Middletown, Columbia, and Harrisburg.

Mr. Hoptak has worked as an interpreter and educator with the National Park Service since 2006, first at Antietam National Battlefield and, since




We also look forward to celebrating our 65th anniversary in May, a testament to the enduring legacy of our Round Table. Stay tuned for more information as we get closer to that event.




