
Flames Beyond Gettysburg—In the Footsteps of Jubal Early

Please join the *Harrisburg and Hershey Civil War Round Tables* on Saturday, October 19, 2024, as we follow in the footsteps of Maj. Gen. Jubal Early during the 1863 Confederate invasion of Adams and York counties, with the author of the leading book on the subject as our guide. This trip picks up where our Fall 2023 trip to Winchester, VA, left off; our guide is back by popular demand.

On June 26, 1863, Early's division chased away almost 1,000 Pennsylvania emergency militia infantry and cavalry from Gettysburg in a series of skirmishes. The next day, Early sent Brig. Gen. John B. Gordon's brigade, fronted by Virginia cavalry, through Gettysburg on the turnpike toward York. We will follow Gordon's route, passing by his well-preserved June 27th campsite at Farmers, PA, near where civic authorities surrendered York. We will then visit Hanover Junction where the 35th Battalion, Virginia Cavalry raided the junction, burned the covered bridge and turntable, and severed telegraph lines after chasing off more militia. This site is also associated with Abraham Lincoln's trip in November 1863 to deliver the Gettysburg Address.



We will next drive to Penn Park in downtown York, the site of the wartime U.S. Army General Hospital. There, we will discuss Early's occupation and ransom of York and Colonel I.E. Avery's North Carolina brigade and its relationship to the hospital. Early ordered Gordon to seize the covered bridge at Wrightsville, the world's longest such structure. Taking the same route as Gordon, we will pause at the riverbank to discuss the defense of the river, and the burning of the Columbia-Wrightsville bridge. After crossing the river to Columbia, we will visit Zion Hill Cemetery, the final resting place of some of the Black defenders of Wrightsville as well as members of the famed 54th and 55th Massachusetts and various US Colored Troops. We will then drive back to York and Gettysburg, following the route Early took on June 30th as his troops returned to Gettysburg to fight in the climactic battle of the Civil War.

He also has written six scenario books for miniature wargaming. He received lifetime achievement awards from the York County History Center and the Camp Curtin Historical Society for his many contributions to local history. His books and wargaming scenario books have received or been nominated for numerous national awards. He is a much sought-after Civil War Round Table speaker and tour guide.
