HCWR7 Launches Its 66th Campaign Near

While the memory of our grand 65th Anniversary celebration in May and our stimulating 2024 Nye-Sommers lecture in June is fresh in our minds, the question is: *what are we going to do for an encore*?

We've assembled an incredible line-up of speakers for Campaign 66. Gettysburg National Military Park Chief of Interpretation Christopher Gwinn will kick off in September with a riveting talk on Little Round Top, including an update on recent renovation work there. Brian Matthew Jordan will be our Veterans Day speaker, discussing his book *Marching Home: Union Veterans and Their Unending Civil War*, which was a finalist for the Pulitzer Prize. Jennifer Murray returns in December to examine Meade, Grant, and the Overland Campaign. Army War College professor Doug Douds will join us in January to compare the staff work by Meade and Lee's "commanding machines" at Gettysburg, fresh from successfully defending his doctoral thesis on the subject. Best-selling author Fergus Bordewich will be our Black History Month speaker in February, recounting how President Grant sent federal troops into the South to decimate the KKK and save Reconstruction. Craig Symonds, the nation's preeminent naval historian, will join us in March to address Farragut and the Battle of Mo-

bile Bay. Chris Mackowski, who has led us on four recent field trips, will join us in April to discuss Grant's battle with throat cancer while writing his personal memoirs. And in May, the nation's leading Lincoln scholar, Harold Holzer, will examine Lincoln's support of immigration, as he delivers the 2025 Nye-Sommers Lecture.

So, there is much to look forward to as we embark on our 66th campaign year. We strive to bring you the very best speakers, and hope you will come out and hear what they have to say in the year ahead. As this newsletter went to press, there were only three seats left on our 56-passenger bus.


Once those are filled, Steve Williamson will compile a wait list based on the order in which additional registrations are received.


If any registrants fall out between now and the date of the trip, as some inevitably will, Steve will fill those vacancies from the wait list.

Preservation Update

Battlefield preservation is a key part of the HCWRT's mission. At its August 3 meeting, the HCWRT's Board of Directors voted to donate \$1,000 to the American Battlefield Trust to protect 132 acres at three battlefields threated by development. It made this donation in honor of Dr. Richard J. Sommers, who was a pillar and benefactor of our Round Table for decades.

An 88-acre site at Fort Blakely, near Mobile Bay, Alabama, saw fighting by one of the largest contingents of US Colored Troops involved in a Civil War attack. A 35-acre Chaffin's Farm site at New Market Heights, Virginia, and a 9-acre Pebbles' Farm site at Petersburg were written about by Dr. Sommers in his book, *Richmond Redeemed*. Chaffin's Farm also saw fighting by the USCT, 14 of whom received the Congressional Medal of Honor. The Peebles' Farm site includes a house used by General Grant.








