"It Would Be Injurious to the Army to Have Two Heads": Meade, Grant and the Overland Campaign

Civil War history has consistently framed the final two years of the war as an epic contest between Grant and Lee and has too frequently overshadowed the role of Meade, commander of the Army of the Potomac. Grant's arrival to the Eastern Theater in March 1864 signaled a new command dynamic for Meade and his army. An examination of the relationship between Grant and Meade reveals nuance to the army's 1864 and 1865 campaigns in Virginia and highlights Meade's role in these operations. Rather than being relegated to a secondary, supporting role in the army's command structure, Meade exercised incredible influence on operations during the campaign.



ON A GREAT BATTLEFIELD

Dr. Murray is a military historian, with a specialization in the American Civil War, in the Department of History at Oklahoma State University. Her most recent publication is *On A Great Battle-field: The Making, Management, and Memory of Gettysburg National Military Park, 1933-2013*, published in 2014, with an updated version that includes a new preface released in the summer of 2023. She is currently working on a full-length biography, tentatively titled *Meade at War,* a comprehensive treatment of Meade's life with a focus on his military career in the Army of the Potomac. She is a veteran faculty member at Gettysburg College's Civil War Institute and a coveted speaker at Civil War symposiums and round tables across the nation.

Spring Field Trip Sold Out: Waiting List Created



Symonds Wins 2024 Gilder-Lehrman Prize for Military History

The Harrisburg CWRT strives to recruit the best military historians in the nation as speakers. Dr. Craig Symonds, who will address our Round Table in March on *David G. Farragut and the Battle of Mobile Bay*, is one of the foremost naval historians in the country. He was the keynote speaker at the 161st Dedication Day ceremonies in Gettysburg National Cemetery in November, where Harold Holzer, who will be our Nye-Sommers lecturer in May, read Lincoln's Gettysburg Address. Dr. Symonds has also been named the winner of the \$50,000 Gilder-Lehrman Prize for Military History for 2024 for his book, *Nimitz at War. Command Leadership from Pearl Harbor to Tokyo Bay*. 
