## HCWR7 Launches Its 67th Campaign Year

the National Civil War Museum in Harrisburg this summer. He will speak on *Duty Well and Faithfully Done: The United States Regular Army at the Battle of Gettysburg.* 

He'll be followed by Licensed Battlefield Guide James A. Hessler on October 10. Always a popular and entertaining speaker, Mr. Hessler will regale us with a stimulating talk on *Dan Sickles: His Life and Legacy*.

Our annual Veterans Day engagement will take place on November 7, featuring Gettysburg National Military Park Ranger Dan Welch, who will speak on *David Wills and the Creation of the National Cemetery at Gettysburg.* What better way to honor our veterans than to hear how Wills moved heaven and earth (lots of it) in the months following the battle to ensure those who did not survive it were given an honorable burial on a portion of that battlefield?

As we step off smartly into our 67th campaign year, it is time for our members to show their support for our efforts by paying their annual dues.

At the HCWRT Board of Directors meeting on June 14 the Board voted to increase our annual dues to \$30.00 for a Single Membership and \$45.00 for a Family Membership. [Student Memberships remain unchanged at \$5.00 annually.] This is the first increase in dues in 20 years, and reflects the increased costs associated with running our Round Table.

In an effort to make the dues collection process more convenient for our members, the Round Table is continuing our practice of collecting dues by invoicing each member directly. Those of you who have email addresses will shortly receive an invoice from our bookkeeper, asking you to log on to our website and renew your membership by paying your dues for Campaign 67 with a credit card or PayPal.

If you do not receive an invoice by email, you can still go to our website at <a href="https://harrisburgcwrt.org/membership">https://harrisburgcwrt.org/membership</a> and either click on the online membership form to pay by credit card or PayPal, or click on the mail-in membership form link to print out a membership renewal form. Those without Internet access can simply fill out the membership form on page 4 of this newsletter and mail the form, with a \$30.00 or \$45.00 check made out to HCWRT, to our new mailing address:

Rather than use our treasurer's home address as we have in the past, we are using a P.O. box for our business needs to have a consistent address for any correspondence regarding our tax-exempt status.

In June, our Board also voted to increase our dinner costs from \$32.00 to \$35.00. As I noted during our annual business meeting in June, the Round Table has been losing \$4.00 per person at our dinner meetings for the last two years. \$35.00 remains a very reasonable cost for the wonderful buffet offerings that we have, the camaraderie that comes with breaking bread with fellow members, and the opportunity to hear world-class speakers at our meetings!

A word about our website. We have begun transitioning this summer from the website we've used since 2018 to a new version, which we plan to launch in January 2026. The domain name [harrisburgcwrt.org] will remain the same, but the new website should be much more user friendly. We have not announced any of the upcoming events for campaign 67 yet on our current website, but will announce them shortly. Don't be thrown off by this—as our cover story illustrates, we have a lot of outstanding speakers lined up.

I look forward to seeing all of you when we kick off Campaign 67 in September. Bring a friend to enjoy our camaraderie at our dinner. Enjoy the rest of your summer!

# Stroll Down Memory Lane


- ◆ From 1961 -1965, the United States Civil War Centennial Commission was established by Congress as a nationwide commemoration of the Civil War. Ulysses S. Grant III was the first Chairman. States were encouraged to develop their own commemoration events; although, just as 100 years earlier, geographical differences arose, so there was some tension. Over the four years, multiple National Assemblies were conducted with noted historians of the day speaking, including Bruce Catton, James "Bud" Robertson, Frank VanDiver, Bell Wiley, and John Simon. Several of these noted historians also spoke to our Round Table.
- ◆ In past years, spring and fall HCWRT field trips were week-end tours with attendees car pooling to a rendezvous spot and going from there in individual cars—hopefully, as on occasion campaigners went to a different meet-up, or got lost. The 1969 tour schedule began in March with a helicopter flight over the Gettysburg Battlefield for a bird's-eye view, and "other planned activity to fill out the day." April was the spring week-end trip to Appomattox; May, Mosby's Confederacy; September, Retreat from Gettysburg; October was the fall week-end trip to the Shenandoah Valley; and closing the year— to Washington DC.
- HCWRT and other Round Tables were concerned with threats to battlefields by developers. With some success, they participated in letter writing campaigns to local Commissioners, Federal Representatives and Senators to express dismay at the commercial encroachment on/near battlefield grounds.
- In 1973 "innovations" were proposed to the monthly meeting program format: one month, the addition of a Civil War Quiz; another month, an "Artifact Night" discussing collecting; finally, a10-minute presentation on one of 4 books by anyone who wanted to participate. It seems like these items are add ons to the regular program, except for the artifacts which may have been the program. Norm Daniels probably knows.
- The Ottenstein Tower at Gettysburg was the site of disgust to Civil War historians and buffs. In spite of HCWRT and other organizational efforts, the tower was built in 1974, and defiled the battlefield according to campaigners. In 2000 it came down when the NPS took possession of the land it was on.
- ♦ This time in 1861 and 1862 Manassas was the site of two major battles: July 21 marked the war's start with First Manassas; August 28-30, 1862 another Confederate success at Second Manassas or Bull Run if you prefer.




# Will Greene to Deliver Nye-Sommers Lecture
