# Friday, September 12—Wayne E. Motts "...Duty Well and Faithfully Done": The United States Regular Army at the Battle of Gettysburg

Join us on Friday, September 15 as we kick off our 67<sup>th</sup> campaign year with a presentation by Wayne E. Motts to celebrate his return as CEO of the National Civil War Museum in Harrisburg.

While most soldiers fighting at Gettysburg, both North and South, were members of their respective state volunteer forces, over 7,100 troops fighting in the Union Army at Gettysburg were part of the United States Regular Army. These soldiers served in the infantry, artillery, and cavalry at Gettysburg and participated in the fighting during all three days of the battle. Many of the regular organizations at the Battle of Gettysburg are still on active duty with today's army. Join us as Mr. Motts explores just a few stories of the thousands of regular army soldiers who fought at Gettysburg.



Mr. Motts is a longtime member of the Harrisburg Civil War Round Table. He returned this summer as CEO of the National Civil War Museum, a position he previously held from 2012 to 2021. He is also the previous President & CEO, as well as President Emeritus & Historian, of the Gettysburg Foundation, which operates the Museum and Visitor's Center at Gettysburg. He has been a licensed battlefield guide at the Gettysburg National Military Park for the past 37 years. For many years, Mr. Motts has devoted much time to the study of the regular army in the Civil War and at the Battle of Gettysburg. He last spoke to our Round Table in 2016 on the book he co-authored with James A. Hessler on Pickett's Charge.

# Eisenhower Returns to Gettysburg

The Majestic Theater in Gettysburg is offering two showings of *Eisenhower: This Piece of Ground*, a one-man play staring Tony award-winning actor John Rubinstein as our 34<sup>th</sup> president, on Friday, October 3, at 7:30 pm and a matinee on Saturday, October 4 at 3:00 pm. The play, which won rave reviews when it debuted off-Broadway in 2023, takes place in Ike's study at his farm in Gettysburg in the 1960s, with him reminiscing about his experiences during his military career and his two terms as president. This is a rare opportunity to see Ike brought back to life in a theater that he regularly attended, only a mile or so away from his Gettysburg home. 
